



You hear about it happening, but you never think it will happen to you. To your family. To someone you love. But it did. It happened to my mom.

In May of 2015, Nancy Gosse, of Medford, went in for her routine physical. During the physical, Aspirus Medford Clinic OB/GYN Dr. Suja Roberts knew something was wrong immediately. After further inspection and testing it was confirmed, Nancy had stage 4 cervical cancer.

"I remember my mom stopping over and telling us she had cancer," says Davis Gosse, of Medford. "My mom was really calm when she told us, so I thought, OK, she has cancer, but she said she was fine so I wasn't super concerned at that point."

It wasn't until much later that Davis and his family found out how advanced the cancer actually was. Nancy sadly passed away in March of 2016, leaving behind a mound of medical bills that couldn't be paid.

"My mom was the one who really took care of the finances for my folks, so with her gone and my dad grieving, he needed help and didn't know where to go or what to do," Davis says.

That's when Davis, through the education of a family friend, found out about the Aspirus Financial Assistance Program.

"It was nice to have someone there who had an idea of where to go and what to do with all the paperwork that comes with a death, including things like how many death certificates to order," Davis says. "That sweet lady, Jenny [Spor, in Aspirus Medford Hospital's financial assistance office], gave me a lot of direction and a lot of helpful info to help me navigate the paperwork and processes. When you're filling out all the paperwork for a death, I'll even say, I got lost. She helped us keep the stress levels down by checking what I did and saying this is what you need to do now. It was just having somebody there to give me direction on what I should be doing next...it was a blessing."

A few weeks after submitting the necessary paperwork for the Financial Assistance Program, Davis' dad received a phone call that would change everything.

"My mom's medical bills had been covered 100%..." -Davis Gosse

"I was really shocked by that. Everything for my mom's medical care was covered. The Financial Assistance Program not only saved my dad, but me and my other family members that would have needed to help cover the costs. It would have drained not one family, but four. With losing my mom, this past year was truly the worst year of my life. And I would have been lost without the Financial Assistance Program."

Prenatal Care Program Offers Moms Personal Support

In the summer of 2015, Aspirus Medford Clinic enhanced its Prenatal Care program by providing its services free to all expecting moms. The program offers benefits such as help choosing an OB provider, review of health care coverage, prenatal and postnatal health and wellness information, breastfeeding education, personal support

and more. Studies show that women who receive prenatal care services have significantly better birth outcomes, give birth to fewer low birth-weight babies, have fewer preterm deliveries and more. This program complements our OB providers' care.

Helping Children and Adults who Struggle to Read

Aspirus Medford Clinic Pediatrician Cathy Reuter, MD, FAAP, along with Taylor County Literacy Council member and Intervention Specialist Jina Lange, presented a free beginning Orton-Gillinghambased reading instruction course in the Fall of 2015. The class was designed for adults wishing to help struggling child and/or adult readers. Dr. Reuter has advanced

training in Orton-Gillingham techniques for helping struggling readers while Jina Lange is trained in Orton-Gillingham and Wilson techniques.

The Orton-Gillingham approach to reading instruction has proven very successful for individuals with difficulty reading and for those with dyslexia.

A Walk To Remember

Annually in October, Aspirus Medford Hospital & Clinics participates in "A Walk to Remember." The annual walk is dedicated to the memory of infants lost during pregnancy or infancy. October is recognized as National Pregnancy and Infant Loss Awareness month.



The Government's Survey Says...

Aspirus Medford Hospital & Clinics demonstrates excellence in patient care

The U.S. Department of Health & Human Services publishes a national survey - the Hospital Consumer Assessment of Healthcare Providers and Systems (HCAHPS). It asks patients about their experiences during a recent hospital stay.

The chart below compares Aspirus Medford Hospital & Clinics to the national and state averages. Aspirus Medford Hospital & Clinics scored higher than the Wisconsin and National average in all eleven questions asked.

Based on these ratings, Aspirus Medford Hospital & Clinics was designated a 5-star Hospital.

This 5-Diamond status is granted to dialysis centers that put patients first by making sure staff and patients know and use the principles of patient safety at all times.

To maintain 5-Diamond distinction, the Kidney Care Center requires staff and patients to complete a series of lessons meant to improve awareness of patient safety issues and to teach and/or reinforce the safety techniques that protect patients.

Aspirus Medford Again Named a Top 20 Critical Access Hospital

For the second year in a row, Aspirus Medford Hospital was named as one of the Top 20 highest ranked Critical Access Hospitals in the nation by the National Rural Health Association. There are more than 1,300 Critical Access Hospitals in the United States.

"To be ranked among the Top 20 Critical Access Hospitals in the nation for two consecutive years says a lot about the high-quality, patient-centered care available at our hospital and the skill and dedication of our staff," said Gregg Olson, Aspirus Medford Hospital & Clinics President/CEO. "An accomplishment of this magnitude is only achieved through a team commitment to excellence. I personally am so proud to work with professionals who have the drive to provide the best patient care possible, no matter their position, and who are willing to go the extra mile to achieve their goal."

A Critical Access Hospital (CAH) is a hospital located in a rural area that provides 24-hour emergency services, is limited to 25 acute care beds and focuses on community needs.

Foundation donates \$150,000 to purchase MRI machine to benefit thousands

Aspirus Medford Foundation Donors gave \$150,000 to help purchase a \$1.3 million MRI machine for Aspirus Medford Hospital. More than 1,000 patients will use the machine in the next year alone.

MRI (Magnetic Resonance Imaging) is a test that uses magnetic fields and radio waves to make pictures of the inside of the body. For the past 10 years, Shared Medical Services was contracted to provide this service at Aspirus Medford Hospital. Its MRI machine is located in a semitruck that is only available at the hospital certain days of the week.

Buying its own MRI machine will allow Aspirus Medford Hospital to bring MRI services indoors. This will better meet patient needs because it will:

- Be available every day.
- Be easier for everyone to reach due to its location in an exam room on the hospital's main floor.
- Be more comfortable simply because it is not within the belly of a truck.
- Allow for more sophisticated testing/imaging.

The expected start date of the indoor MRI is the winter of 2017.


