Nurses take photos of the precious first few days of the babies' and families' time together and provide the camera's memory card to the family as a gift when they are ready to go home. In addition, eight new bassinets have been provided to comfort babies in the Birthing Center.

The Mullins have since happily welcomed a healthy baby girl named, Reagan. Danielle stated, "It will be neat for Reagan to grow up and see the many ways that newborns and families in our community are being supported because of her sister, Brennan, and their family's gifts to the Brennan Mullins Newborn Support Fund."

Five-year old Kian has a rare heart defect and is unable to walk or crawl. He tried using a gait trainer a few times at school and showed signs that he liked using it. However, he was only able to use it at school two times a month when he had physical therapy. His mom wanted Kian to have a gait trainer to use at home in order to gain strength and coordination so he is able to move independently. Because of the Aspirus Health Foundation's support, Kian received a KidWalk gait trainer that he can use to be mobile just like all of the other kids.

His mom says, "Kian is getting much stronger in his lower body and able to make choices about where he wants to be. He is able to enjoy an upright position and get around outdoors without the use of his wheelchair."

- A child's parents can't afford the inhaler he needs, so he struggles to breathe so that his parents can put food on the table for the family.
- An elderly woman is embarrassed to ask for help, so she stretches the supplies to clean her wound, and it ends up getting worse and causing severe pain.
- A veteran who lives in transitional housing can't afford transportation to his doctor's visit, so he cancels his appointment, and his mental health spirals out of control.

Gifts to this fund help provide a safety net for people through a program designed to support immediate needs until they can be connected with community resources.

"We're grateful for the support of our employees and donors to help care for people in our community who cannot help themselves," remarked Smerda.

Gifts from Aspirus Women's Golf Classic Support Important Community Needs

The 10th anniversary Aspirus Women's Golf Classic held on Monday, August 1, 2016, at the Wausau Country Club in Schofield raised \$120,349.

More than 250 golfers, caddies, and volunteers partnered with Aspirus and many businesses and community members to raise funds for two important causes. The proceeds will support:

- Children and adult victims of sexual assault and abuse by advancing a nurse examiner program at Aspirus Wausau Hospital.
- Children's brain development through a novel, interactive, and fun approach using books through the Reach Out and Read program at Aspirus Clinics.

Aspirus Wausau Hospital is advancing a Sexual Assault Nurse Examiner (SANE) program to support children and adult victims during this traumatic time of their lives. The program provides medical care and the expertise needed to correctly collect forensic evidence to pursue criminal convictions against their abusers. Proceeds from the Golf Classic will support extensive training for nurses, as well as specialized forensic equipment and supplies for evidence collection in the emergency room at Aspirus Wausau Hospital. "All of our emergency department nurses are trained in caring for domestic violence victims, but sexual assault cases require additional care, particularly when collecting evidence," said Robin Rudie, RN, nursing director of the emergency department at Aspirus Wausau Hospital. "Nurses who receive SANE certification are committed to these victims and have a passion for helping people who have suffered through this experience."

"I personally want to thank the Aspirus Health Foundation and my community for this year's Women's Golf Classic to support the SANE Program," said Heidi Wolfe. "I hold this program very near and dear to my heart as I'm a survivor of sexual assault by a family member, once as a child and again at the age of 41.

The SANE program is extremely important to a victim in the Emergency Room. I can say without a doubt the first person a victim meets that shows compassion, empathy, and understanding will help give the victim strength and hope after a traumatic life experience. Also, the process of how professionally and compassionately evidence is gathered will play a significant role in obtaining justice in a courtroom, as well as comforting the victim."
